SJR 1	WIELECHOWSKI	Proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Alaska relating to the Alaska permanent fund, establishing the earnings reserve account, relating to the permanent fund dividend, and requiring the permanent fund dividend be at least equal to the amount that would be calculated under current law.
SJR 2	MACKINNON	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Alaska relating to contracting state debt for postsecondary student loans.
SJR 3	KELLY	Proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Alaska to increase the number of members on the judicial council; relating to the initial terms of new members appointed to the judicial council; and relating to the confirmation of members of the judicial council.
